








Experience about environmental law







### What is it

?

Students created it in 1998.



It started because we could see a lack of specialised environmental legal advice for NGO's. By organising volunteer activities on issues where there is a pending legal process we hope to ensure that environmental problems are not forgotten or ignored.

### What do we do?

#### 1. Legal work

De Amicitia is a team of environmental lawyers who work to defend the environment and give legal advice on environmental issues. This service is primarily aimed at NGOs and other private or public organizations that want to protect the natural environment.

### Why?

- Few members of the NGOs have environmental legal expertise and so are unaware of the existing environmental legislation.
- NGOs do not have the economic resources to initiate legal procedures against those causing environmental destruction, or they use their limited economic resources for other purposes.
- Environmental legislation is not easily used by judges and courts. This can be for many reasons including a lack of understanding, fear of the consequences of a strict application of the law, direct and indirect pressure from industrial lobbies or lack of awareness on the part of judges and magistrates about the importance of preserving the natural environment and rural life.


#### **Effects:**

International networking and participation in platforms, municipalities and other organizations.


